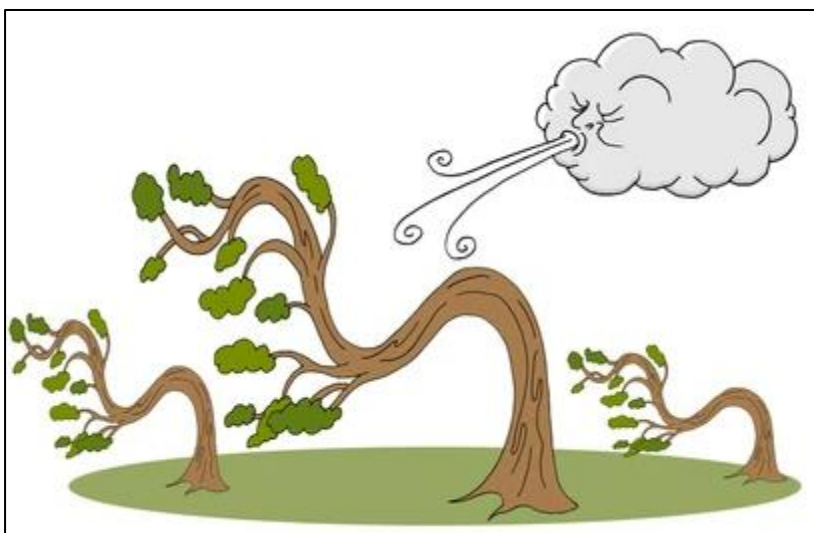

Daylight Saving Time begins on **Sunday, March 12, 2023**, at 2:00 A.M. At this time, we "spring forward" one hour.

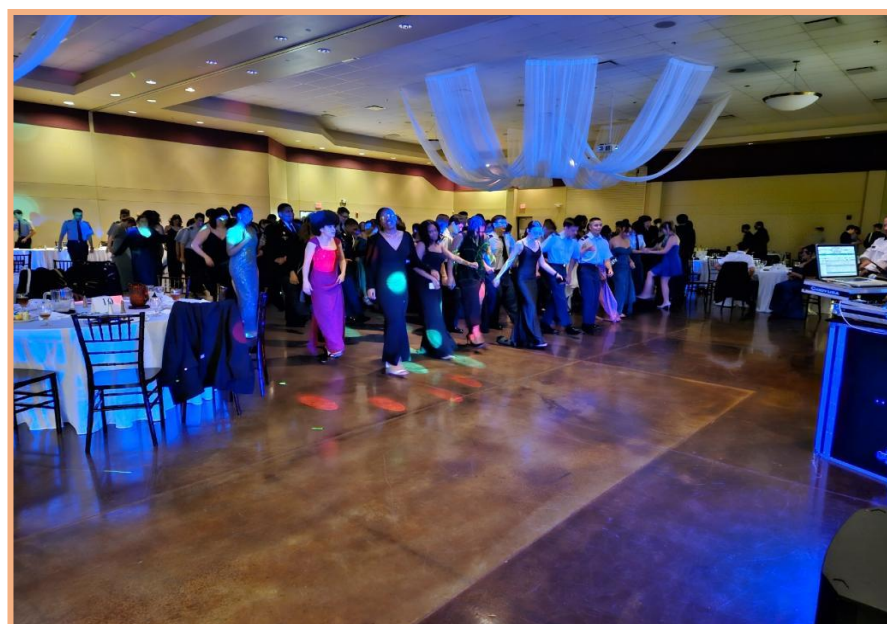
SAFETY

Please be careful of future high wind and sudden weather changes as winter will soon end and spring season will start on 20 March 2023.

Below are some suggestive ideas:

- *Check, Test & Inspect Smoke Alarms & Carbon Monoxide Detectors.
- *Clean & Reposition Outdoor Security Cameras.
- *Review Outdoor Lighting & Motion Detection.
- *Ensure Contact Sensors Are Properly Placed on Windows & Doors.
- *Keep Garages & Sheds Secure.
- *Inspect Chimneys, Roofs & Gutters.
- *Deep clean your dryer (lint trap) with a vacuum hose attachment and outside vent.
- *Clean around your gas furnace.
- *Maintain your emergency detector (smoke & carbon monoxide) by cleaning and change battery.
- *Check your fire extinguisher.
- *Inspect for mold
- *Audit your emergency kit.
- *Manage electrical cords.
